Welcome to our third newsletter of the year.

What is our learning project? Our learning project this month is ‘who can help us?’ During this month, the children will have the opportunity to explore the indoor and outdoor environments, including how we help in pre-school and who can help us. This project gives the children the opportunity to learn more about the world around them and gaining knowledge by asking staff questions, staff will help them further by researching answers to their questions to encourage and extend interest in the project area.

We will also continue to look at the seasonal change of Autumn taking place and exploring what changes take place e.g. weather/ leaves. We will also explore that Winter is coming next with colder weather.

What activities might we explore? We will be exploring a wide range of activities within all six areas of the curriculum and learning through play. We will share photos and videos of activities within the classroom with you on Seesaw. Children will have the opportunity to initiate their own play and to continue to develop interactions with peers. Our shape of the month (a triangle) and colour of the month (red) will be explored through a variety of activities including colour and shape hunts.

We will use ICT to look at who can help us and explore how they help us. We will also do group activities and games which promotes helping peers and staff. We will be exploring how we can ask for help if we need some. For nursery rhyme week we will be exploring some relating activities for the rhymes such as matching games, crafts, and role play.

What might we sing or read? Children will have the opportunity to explore project related books freely in our cosy areas e.g. Going to the doctor. We will also read a range of stories at group time which the children can choose.

To link in with our project, 'who can help us?' we will take part in a range of songs. This includes 'Down at the Firehouse' and 'Miss Polly had a dolly.' Our song sheet is available for all parents on seesaw and to download from our website.

Children will also be invited to share their favourite songs and stories with peers and staff.

Additional activities planned?

Children in Need activities – to celebrate children in need we will have a range of related activities and crafts for the children to take part in from 9th to 15th November.

World Nursery Rhyme week – this takes place between 16th to 20th November. We will share the rhymes and relating activities via seesaw throughout the week.

What skills are we focussing on? This month we will continue to focus on building children's independence skills. We will continue to work on the independence skill of putting on their own coat. This is an important skill to develop for transitioning between the indoor and outdoor environment. As we had an extended half term break, we will continue to begin to take part in the snack time and self-registration symbol routines.

Through arts and crafts we will be continuing to explore scissor use and developing our fine motor skills to use them.

Home activity ideas:

Each month we encourage children and their families to take part in some home activities. There are some home learning ideas on our November plans shared via seesaw and news section on the webpage. We encourage parents/guardians to engage in these alongside their child to build a school to home link. Some activities will be;

Counting objects within the home e.g. how many chairs or how many beds is there in our house?
Reading stories as part of the bedtime routine and can you spot any triangles inside or outside?
