Welcome to our second newsletter of the year.

### **Where to access information.**

**What is our learning project?** Our learning project this month is ‘Where does it come from’. During this month, the children will have the opportunity to explore the indoor and outdoor environments, investigating our different garden areas and any natural materials that they may find. This project gives the children the opportunity to learn more about the world around them and gaining knowledge by asking staff questions, staff will help them further by researching answers to their questions to encourage and extend interest in the theme.

We will also look at the seasonal change of Autumn taking place and exploring what changes take place e.g. weather/ leaves.

**What activities might we explore?** We will be exploring a wide range of activities within all six areas of the curriculum and learning through play. We will share photos and videos of activities within the classroom with you on Seesaw. Children will have the opportunity to initiate their own play and to continue to develop interactions with peers. Our shape of the month (a circle) and colours of the month (orange and brown) will be explored through a variety of activities including colour and shape hunt.

We will introduce the season of Autumn and discuss the changes in the environment that occur. The boys and girls will explore animals who hibernate during the season of Autumn. During circle time the children will have the opportunity to express their own ideas and thoughts about our new learning project and we discuss the shape of a circle and where we can find it in our environments.

**What might we sing or read?** Children will have the opportunity to explore books freely in our cosy areas e.g. Harry the hedgehog. In addition, we will introduce the season of Autumn through stories. We will also read group stories promoting appropriate behaviours in school e.g. sharing. To link in with our project, 'Where does it come from' we will take part in a range of songs. This includes 'The leaves on the trees' and 'Scarecrow, Scarecrow'. Our song sheet is available for all parents on seesaw and on our website.

Children will also be invited to share their favourite songs and stories with peers and staff. What do they sing at home? Do they have a bedtime story they enjoy?

### **Additional activities planned?**

Rainbow Day – Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Children can wear bright clothing for 'make a wish' charity in memory of a special little boy. More information on Seesaw.3

Dress up party – this month we will be having a party day before our half term break. This will be on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October.

**What skills are we focussing on?** This month we will continue to focus on building children's independence skills. This will include entering Jolly Pirates independently and confidently separating from parent/guardian. We will also continue to work on the independence skill of putting on their own coat. This is an important skill to develop for transitioning between the indoor and outdoor environment. We will also be focusing on learning our rules and routines within the classroom environment. An additional letter will be sent home to share this with parents and we will post videos/ photos on seesaw. This month we are also practicing using our snack symbol and starting registration symbols.

### **Home activity ideas:**

Each month we encourage children and their families to take part in some home activities. There are some home learning ideas on our October plans shared via seesaw and webpage. We encourage parents/guardians to engage in these alongside their child to build a school to home link. Some activities will be;

A nature hunt or walk with your child collecting leaves, conkers, etc for bringing into school so we can use them in our art area.
